From The Pastor

Surely Mother Teresa is one of the most influential of the modern saints. Her devotion to the poor, the helpless, and the dying reminds us of our obligation to care for our brothers and sisters in Christ. In serving, she taught us the power of love.

How did she become such a beacon of love?

In her own words, she learned about love from a 4 year old boy, the child of Hindu parents.

At her orphanage and hospital, they had run completely out of sugar, not an uncommon occurrence. That doesn't seem too important to us, but to those who were suffering, who had so few pleasures in life, the lack of sugar was no small matter.

Somehow, this little boy learned about the lack of sugar. He said to his parents, "I will not eat sugar for 3 days. I will give my sugar to Mother Teresa."

His parents could not believe that he would make such a sacrifice, but he did. On the 3rd day, his mother and father brought him to Mother Teresa.

She wrote, "He was so small, and in his hand he had a little bottle of sugar. How much can a 4 year old child eat? But the amount he could have eaten for 3 days, he brought.

"He could scarcely pronounce my name, but yet he gave and the love he put in the giving was beautiful." (*My Life for the Poor*, by Mother Teresa)

That small bottle made no difference at all to the orphans and the dying. But it made a difference to Mother Teresa. In his small but true sacrifice, she caught a vision of self-giving love, a vision which sustained her all her life long.

In the same way, the sacrifices we make for love are never wasted.

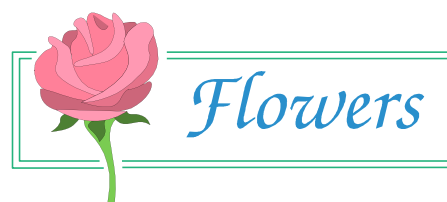
When we give something up for God--no matter how great or how small--God blesses it and multiplies it as he multiplied the bread and fish to feed thousands of people on a hillside.

I ask you to consider, along with me, how we can offer something to God out of love--a sacrifice that will bless God's heart.

I know that God is waiting to honor what we offer him. I can't wait to see what's going to happen when we imitate one small boy
